Petition received by the Queensland Legislative Assembly No. 1619-11

The Coordinator-General has not received an application for a one hundred per cent 'fly-in/fly-out' workforce from any central Queensland mine.

The Office of the Coordinator-General continues to advise resource companies that choices should be made available to resource workers in relation to where they live.

The Coordinator-General works with local communities, councils and resource companies to preserve the liveability and sustainability of towns in mining regions.

Through the public and government agency consultation process at the various stages of the EIS process, namely Terms of Reference, EIS, Supplementary EIS and Change Request Application, there are a number of opportunities for the public to have its say on major resource developments.

Social impact issues are conditioned by the Coordinator-General to be addressed in a Social Impact Management Plan for each major project, and are monitored by the Coordinator-General's Social Impact Assessment Unit.
