I refer to your petition (No: 1012-08) to the Honourable the Speaker and Members of the Legislative Assembly concerning the Code of Practice for pigs which was tabled on 27 August 2008.

A revised 3rd edition of the Pig Code has recently been published. It provides standards and guidelines to safeguard the welfare of pigs while recognising the need to bring in some of the changes over time so that the impact can be managed by industry.

The revised 3rd edition of the Pig Code (Primary Industries Report Series 92) is available via http://www.publish.csiro.au/nid/22/sid/11.htm.

Model Codes of Practice provide direction on what is appropriate and reasonable under the circumstances. The *Animal Care and Protection Act 2001* and the codes provide a balance between the welfare of animals, community expectations, and the interests of persons whose livelihood is dependent on these animals.

The codes are developed nationally in extensive consultation with a wide range of groups such as animal industries, animal welfare organisations, governments, universities and specialist organisations such as the Australian Veterinary Association. Revision of the codes is undertaken via a national review process that involves representatives of all these stakeholders. Community feedback on new and revised codes is sought through a public consultation process.

As part of a national process, the key standards arising from the 3rd edition Pig Code will be prepared for inclusion in the *Animal Care and Protection Regulation 2002* and therefore will be enforceable by law. A high level working group is guiding the implementation of the 3rd edition Pig Code to provide for national consistency.

Confinement of sows in stalls during pregnancy is recognised as a significant animal welfare issue. In the future, sows can be confined in sow stalls for only the first six weeks of their pregnancy. This recommendation is consistent with international decisions on the husbandry of pigs and encourages industry to look towards improved production systems in the future. The 3rd edition Pig Code recognises the scientific evidence showing that confining sows during early pregnancy decreases the risk of injury and loss of pregnancy due to aggression from other pigs.
