Dear Mr Laurie

Thank you for your letter of 19 March 2004 enclosing a copy of a petition received by the Queensland Legislative Assembly (No 248-03) lodged by the Honourable Kev Lingard MP, Member for Beaudesert.

I note that the petition seeks a review of the current policies and procedures under the *Child Protection Act 1999* and requests the adoption of a broad-based approach to responding to children's needs for protection.

In June 2003, the Queensland Government endorsed *The Strategic Framework for Child Protection 2003 - 2006.* This framework provides a foundation for policy and service development across state government agencies with respect to child protection. It is aimed at achieving better outcomes for children and young people who have been significantly harmed or are at risk of harm, and has a strong focus on prevention and early intervention.

An Action Plan to implement this framework was also endorsed. It outlines a number of initiatives that government agencies including the Queensland Police Service, Queensland Heath, Education Queensland and the Department of Emergency Services will implement over the next four years.

In June 2002, the Queensland Government launched the *Queensland Families: Future Directions* strategy. This strategy committed funds of \$148 million and outlined the government's commitment to supporting and assisting children, young people and families to help achieve better outcomes for Queensland children, young people and families. Initiatives that are currently funded under this strategy are outlined in the attached document.

Petitioners can be assured that as a result of the recommendations of the recent Crime and Misconduct (CMC) Inquiry, the Department of Child Safety is to implement the child protection reforms as outlined in, *The Blueprint Report, Protecting Children: An Inquiry Into Abuse of Children in Foster Care.* The Blueprint prescribes sweeping changes to child protection policies and procedures, including those relating to voluntary care, access to therapeutic treatment, processes for responding to cases of suspected child abuse, and the recruitment, training and reimbursement of foster carers.

The commitment by the government in implementing the Blueprint for child protection reforms involves a total of \$201.6 million per year additional funding by 2006-07 which will bring Queensland's child protection funding above the national average (based on 2002-03 Productivity Commission data).

By December 2004, the Department of Child Safety will be established and fully operational as the government's lead agency for child protection. Improved outcomes for vulnerable children will be achieved through the following types of reforms that are additional to those effecting change to departmental policies and procedures:

- 518 additional staff for the Department of Child Safety over the next three years;
- 71 additional Commission for Children and Young People staff over the next three years;
- 23 new or expanded Aboriginal and Islander Child Care Agencies and a new Indigenous Support Branch in the Department of Child Safety;
- staged increases in payments for foster carers;
- alternative care for 680 young people who are not suited to conventional foster care (to be phased in over four years);
- more training and recruitment and retention strategies for frontline child protection staff; and
- more therapeutic services such as counselling and disability support for children in care.

I trust that this information if of assistance to you.
