An Act to amend the Criminal Code to provide for the offence of giving false evidence before Parliament and to make a particular consequential amendment to the *Parliament of Queensland Act 2001*

The Parliament of Queensland enacts— 1

‘57 False evidence before Parliament 12

‘(1) A person who, during an examination before the Legislative Assembly or a committee of the Legislative Assembly, knowingly gives a false answer to a lawful and relevant question put to the person during the examination commits a crime. 13 14 15 16 17

Maximum penalty—7 years imprisonment. 18

‘(2) The offender can not be arrested without warrant. 19

‘(3) A person can not be convicted of the offence defined in this section on the uncorroborated testimony of 1 witness.’. 20 21
